Items for Discussion:

1. 2020-21 Data Review: The principal reviewed the School Improvement Plan and related data. The improvement plan for the LEA made a change to the growth from 10% to 5% but grade level teams are still trying for 10% growth. Reading data for both BOY and MOY assessments was detailed. First, fifth and fourth grades show the highest need. Discipline data shows a more than 80% reduction in office discipline referrals. The after school program to combat the loss of learning due to Covid is servicing approximately 250 students K-8. Additionally, the principal explained that the data for junior high students who meet their minutes of math practice (using ALEKS) directed to happen in the hour when students go home is showing positive outcomes in math scores.

- 2. 2021-2022 Upcoming School Plan Design: After reviewing data, the council agreed the academic and social-emotional needs supported in the 2020-21 school year by the plan are still applicable and goals should remain for the upcoming 2021-22 school year. The council reviewed expenditures line-by-line and made small adjustments. The council discussed the benefits of having more paraprofessionals returned to the classroom as compared to the year previous. Administration indicated input from employees and parents both saw a big difference positively with the additional support to help improve reading, math and SEL skills. The council added funds for upper grade teachers to be able to monitor chromebook usage and continue online programs like ALEKS.
- 3. Approval: Julie Clark made a motion to approve the 2021-22 plan budget. Natalie Westwood seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously. Natalie Westwood then made a motion to approve the entire 2021-22 proposed plan since the first motion was only made on the budget. Christina Pehrson seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
- 4. Final Approval by the Board: The Summit Academy Independence 2021-22 Proposed Land Trust plan was approved by the Summit Academy Board of Trustees on March 18, 2021.
